DEVELOPMENT MATTERS 30 - 50 MONTHS (2.5 YEARS - 4.1 YEARS)

Areas from the Nursery Curriculum that would be wonderful if children have already achieved...

- · "can attend to toileting needs most of the time themselves.
- · Can usually manage washing and drying hands.
- · ... pulls up own trousers and zipper on coats."

This will make a huge difference to their confidence when they start school.

SELF-CONFIDENCE & SELF-AWARENESS

DEVELOPMENT MATTERS 22-36 MONTHS (1.10 YEAR – 3YEARS)

"Separates from main carer with support and encouragement from a familiar adult."

If you project a relaxed and happy parent, the children will mimic your feelings and be confident to come to school - we sometimes tell parents to pretend!

SCHOOL LUNCHES

All children in Reception are eligible for Free School Meals

Hot school dinners

Meals cooked in school are available for all children, the meals are well prepared, nutritious and healthy. Meals can only be ordered online and must be ordered in advance. Please make sure you have signed up to avail of this service. Water is provided.

Packed lunches

Alternatively children can bring a packed lunch. In line with our healthy schools status we would encourage the lunch boxes to contain a nutritious and balanced meal. Lunchbox guidelines can be found on the school website. Children may bring drinks in non-breakable flasks or cartons. As a school we operate a **NUT FREE** policy ensuring that any children suffering from a nut allergy are not unnecessarily exposed to nuts.

SNACK-TIMES

Fruit

Every infant child throughout Richmond Borough is entitled to a free piece of fruit a day, in Reception we use fruit time as an opportunity to encourage social skills, sharing and independence.

<u>Milk</u>

Every infant child under the age of five is entitled to free milk at school. If your child does not like milk, please let your child's class teacher know.

Water

Drinking water throughout the day has been shown to improve concentration, so children are allowed a water bottle with a pull up stopper which they can drink from during the day. The children's first water bottle is a welcome gift from the PA.

Ways To Support Your Child

Teach your child to ask for a drink, say if they are hungry or if they need the toilet.

Ensure your child is toilet trained.

Help your child recognise their name.

Encourage your child to put their toys away and help to tidy up.

Main Uniform

- · Tights may be royal blue, navy or white NOT black.
- · Socks may be navy or white knee length, ankle for the summer months.
- School mini size rucksack NOT the larger junior one for Reception children.
- · Dark coat as opposed to brightly coloured if buying new please.
- Shoes to take a polish or patent.

PE

- · Shorts royal blue
- · NO track suit bottoms they do not use these until Y1.
- Plimsolls for indoor PE
- School drawstring bag should last 7 years.
