General Information

- Please ensure that you are prompt at collections times as the staff have lunchtime duties or staff meetings with other year groups and will result in your child being taken to the office to await collection.
- All nursery and school information is sent out via the Communicator App (St Edmund's, Whitton). This needs to be downloaded onto your phone from the App store.
- Your child will be dropped off at the cloakroom door, where a member of staff will help them to hang up their coats before they enter the nursery and wash their hands. We would be grateful if you could place any hats, scarves and gloves into your child's coat pockets to speed up the process.
- It is important at this time that your child has no toys from home in their pockets.
- Could you please practise with your child how they should wash their hands as we be washing our hands regularly.

Ways to Help your Child

- Teach your child to ask for a drink, to say they are hungry or need the toilet
- Ensure your child is toilet trained and able to clean themselves.
- Help your child to recognise their name
- Encourage your child to be independent
- Encourage your child to help tidy away

Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum

- We follow the EYFS and aim to cater for the interests that the children may have.
- Last year some of the topics we covered included space, minibeasts, traditional tales, vets, garden centres and cafes.
- We can't wait to see what topics your children will want to explore...

Personal Social and Emotional Development

- Friendly behaviour towards others.
- Continuation of play by children responding to what others are saying or doing.
- Initiation of play by children offering cues for others to join them.
- An understanding that some actions and words can hurt others' feelings.

Communication and Language

- Children listening to others, one to one, or in a small group situation.
- The ability to understand and follow simple instructions.
- An understanding of 'why' and 'how' questions.
- Children beginning to use more complex sentences, using 'and' and 'because' to link ideas and thoughts.
- Questioning why things happen.

Physical Development

- The ability to move with confidence, in a range of ways (e.g. jumping, sliding, skipping).
 The ability to hold a pencil between the thumb and two
 - fingers, copying some letters.
- Being able to attend to toileting needs independently most of the time.
- Dressing with some help (e.g. putting on coat and zipping it up, taking jumper on and off).

Literacy

- Children listening and joining in with stories and poems, one to one, and also in small group situations.
- Children suggesting how a story might end.
- The ability to describe main story events.
- ► An awareness of rhyme.
- An awareness that print carries meaning.
- Children giving their own meaning to the written marks they make.

Maths

- Children using number names and number language spontaneously.
- An interest and curiosity of numerals in the environment.
- The ability to recite numbers in order to 10 and beyond.
- An awareness of shapes in the environment.
- An understanding of positional language (e.g. 'next to', 'under', 'on top')



Understanding the World

- The ability to talk about significant experiences or special events.
- An awareness of living things in the environment.
- An understanding of how to operate simple equipment (e.g. remote control).

Expressive Art and Design

- Joining in with dancing and circle games.
- Joining in with familiar songs.
- An interest in the different textures of things.
- Engagement in imaginative role play, based on first hand experiences.
- Children building stories around toys.

Habits of Mind

At St Edmund's we have been introducing children to the 'Habits of Mind' (Arthur L. Costa and Bena Kallick).

These 'Habits of Mind' are identified as a set of problem solving, life related skills, important for effective learning.

In Nursery we focus on... Managing Impulsivity Striving for Accuracy Taking Responsible Risks

Zones of Regulation

- At St Edmund's we also teach the children about the 'Zones of Regulation'
- This gives the children the emotional vocabulary and understanding to help them identify and self-regulate their emotions.
- If children are able to identify how they are feeling, they can then begin to understand and develop how to respond to situations in a socially acceptable way.
