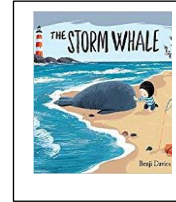

Maths

Number: Multiplication and Division

Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 multiplication tables, including recognising odd and even numbers

Calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division within the multiplication tables and write them using the multiplication (\times), division (\div) and equals ($=$) signs

Geometry

Identify and describe the properties of 2D shapes., including the number of sides and lines of symmetry in a vertical line.
