Spelling Activity Ideas These are activities you might like to use with your child.

<p>Beat the clock Set a timer for 30 seconds. See how many times you can write your word.</p>	<p>In the Air Write your spellings in the air. Have someone read your words as you write them.</p>	<p>Connect the dots. Write your spelling words in dots and then trace over them</p>	<p>Handwriting Hero Write each of your spelling words in joined, school handwriting.</p>
<p>Rainbow Words Write each of your words in pencil. Then trace over your words with a different colour. If you trace carefully, you'll see a rainbow!</p>	<p>Bubble Words Write each for your words in bubble letters. Eg. <i>they</i></p>	<p>Chao-Chao Words Write each of your spelling words end to end as one long word. Use a different colour for each word. Eg. <i>onandgawent</i></p>	<p>Other Handed If you're right handed, write your words with your left hand. If you're left handed, write your words with your right hand.</p>
<p>Something's Missing Have an adult write your words with some of the letters missing. Can you fill in the missing letters?</p>	<p>Rhyme Time Write each of your spelling words. Next to each word write a word that rhymes with it. Your rhyming word can be a nonsense word.</p>	<p>Cross word Create a crossword out of your words. R R E P L A Y L A Y</p>	<p>Messy Words Write your words in something messy. Eg. Mud, flour, paint, chalk.</p>
<p>ABC Write your words in alphabetical order. Can you add in some words from other weeks into the list?</p>	<p>Pyramid words. Write the word one letter at a time. t th the they</p>	<p>Look, Cover, Write, Check Look at your word. Cover your word with one hand and write it with the other. Check you've spelt it correctly.</p>	<p>Fancy letters Write each of your spelling words once normally then go back and write your words in fancy letters. Eg. <i>people</i></p>
<p>Across and Down Write each of your spelling words across and then down. Eg. A N D N D</p>	<p>Silly sentence Write each of your spelling words in a silly sentence that shows you understand its meaning. Eg. <i>there</i> -There are three jellyfish playing in the bath!</p>	<p>Words Within Words Look at your word. Can you spot another word within it? <i>Disappointed</i> <i>Disappointed</i> <i>Disappointed</i></p>	<p>Magazine /News Paper Use an old newspaper / magazine to find your spelling words. Cut them and glue them onto a piece of paper OR you can cut out letters that make up your spelling words</p>
<p>Create a Quiz Create a quiz using your spelling words and include a question for each word. Your questions could be multiple choice, matching or true or false. For fun have someone at home take your quiz!</p>		<p>Friendly Letter Write a letter to a friend, superhero or celebrity using your spelling words. Make sure you use school handwriting and your letter makes sense.</p>
