Greet people and give personal information, ask and talk about sisters and brothers, say what people have and have not using third person *avoir*, say what people are like using *etre* including negatives.

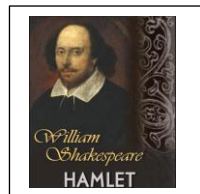
### **Science**

## Year 5 Curriculum Map Autumn Term

### **Maths**

#### **Place Value**

Count forwards or backwards in steps of powers of 10 for any given number up to 1,000,000.  
Interpret negative numbers in context, count forwards and backwards with positive and negative whole numbers, including through zero.  
Round any number up to 1,000,000 to the nearest 10, 100, 1000, 10,000 and 100,000

#### **Addition and Subtraction**

Solve addition and subtraction multi-step problems in context, deciding which operations and methods to use and why

**Multiplication and Division** Multiply numbers up to 4 digits by a one or two-digit number using a formal written method, including long multiplication for two-digit numbers. Multiply and divide numbers mentally, drawing upon known facts. Divide numbers up to 4 digits by a one-digit number using the formal written method of short division and interpret remainders appropriately for the context. Multiply and divide whole numbers and those involving decimals by 10, 100, 1000.
