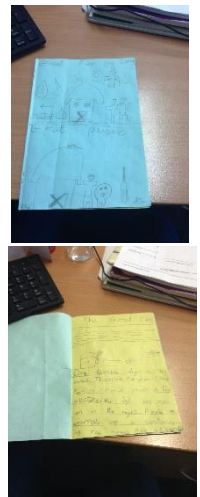

## English

We would like for you to create your own storybook about the events of the Great Fire of London. You may want to create your own character, who was present during these events. It can be completed on the computer or it can be hand written. For the book you must also consider if it needs a glossary, index, contents page or any other appropriate feature. Each book should have a beautifully designed front cover, which is appropriate to the text, and a relevant synopsis at the back. If you are happy to, send us a photo or email with details of your wonderful book.

Please make sure your child remembers to use punctuation and spells the words on the HFW lists correctly and that handwriting continues to be an important focus.

- Read for 20 minutes every day (e-books can be found at <https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/reading/> once you set up a free account).
- Spellings recap on 200 HFW (continue to test your child every week)



## Maths

We have looked at analogue time and also finding a  $\frac{1}{2}$ ,  $\frac{1}{4}$ , and  $\frac{3}{4}$ , of a shape. It would be beneficial if the children could make, or draw, a teaching clock (like the one below) to show an understanding of the different parts of telling the time.

We would also like the children to create a timetable (using an analogue clock) of their everyday activities and record the time that they do these activities. They could complete this by drawing a small clock pointing to the correct time and draw a picture of the activity they completed beside each clock.

Continue to revise your multiplication and division facts for 2,5 and 10. If your child knows these at a rapid speed when you question them, then they could begin to learn their multiplication and division facts for 3.



## Science/Geography

We would like you to research everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard. Can you create a poster describing (using your scientific vocabulary) each material and what that material could be used for? (You may be able to find these materials in use around your house).

On top of the above activities we remind you of the other resources we have available for you.

**RE**
