English

This week, as a school, we are focusing on writing. For this, we would like you like to create your own book. It can be any genre (fiction, non-fiction, poetry etc.) but must be of high quality. It can be completed on the computer or it can be hand written. For the book you must also consider if it needs a glossary, index, contents page or any other appropriate feature. Each book should have a beautifully designed front cover, which is appropriate to the text, and a relevant synopsis at the back. If you are happy to, send us a photo or email with details of your wonderful book. Remember your clear paragraphs, adjectives and adverbs.

Maths

In Year 3, we are recapping time. We have looked at analogue time (to the minute) and began looking at 24 hour digital time. It would be beneficial if the children could make or draw, a teaching clock (like the one below) to show an understanding of the different parts of telling the time.

We would also like children to record how long it takes to do different activities and sequence them. You could use the second hand on a watch or a stop watch on your phone to help with this.

Eg. How long does it take to boil an egg? How long does it take to do 10 sit ups? How long does it take to run around the garden? How long does it take for me to change my bed sheets?



On top of the above activities we remind you of the other resources we have available for you.

We also expect the following to be completed:

DAILY READING/SPELLING/MULTIPLICATION

- Read for 20 minutes every day (e-books can be found at <https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/reading/> once you set up a free account). We have also registered Year 3 for www.getepic.com To access 40,000 ebooks/audiobooks, visit the website and follow these steps:
 1. Go to login (top right corner)
 2. Click on students/educators
 3. In the student login box, enter the class code: njv6377
 4. Find your name and browse for something that interests you!
- Focus on spellings from the 300 HFW and Year 3/4 spelling words. (3 words daily, which then go into the weekly envelope. Test the weekly envelope on the Friday)
- On top of the maths activities above, the children should be learning their multiplication tables. Year 3 expectations is 3, 4 and 8s. This should be rapid recall, without the use of fingers. You can use Rockstar times tables to support this.

RE

During the closure, we would like the children to learn about the major events of Holy Week and to make a **small** Easter Garden. This is to help them reflect on the importance of Easter Sunday and the new life it brings. The Easter garden should include a tomb and a cross and the rest is the children’s own creative choice.

Here are some examples of Easter gardens:



Please take a photo of your child with their garden and e-mail to us. This is so it can be put in their books on their return, especially if the garden is perishable.

Don’t forget to telephone or skype your relatives to check to see how they are getting on.
