The tiger is the biggest
species of the cat family.
Tigers can reach a length
of up to 3.3 metres (11 feet)
and weigh as much as
300 kilograms.

Sometimes there are tigers with
different colours. There are
white tigers that have white
fur with black stripes, or even
pure white fur. No two tigers
have exactly the same pattern of stripes.

Prey

Tigers are thought to be mainly nocturnal predators, and eat lots of different types of prey - mostly other large mammals. All tigers are carnivores (meat eaters).



Habitat



Most tigers live in tropical regions, but the Siberian, or Amur tiger lives in areas of Russia. Tigers currently exist in Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, Nepal, Russia and Thailand. They may also be present in China and North Korea.
