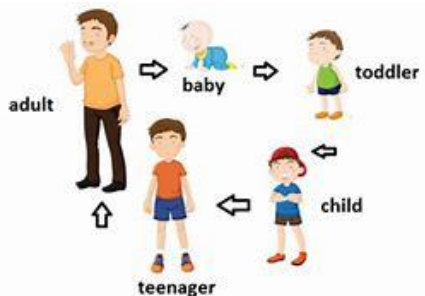
**If you are happy for us to share some of your work on the school website – remember to state on your e-mail that you give us permission to do so.

What 3D shape has circular faces? Why not Watch the video of Mrs Hambling reading The Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle again?	Maths Follow the link to White Rose Maths Activities at the bottom of this timetable and look at Week 3 Day 2: Can you paint or draw caterpillars of different lengths using circles for the body parts? Which is the longest? How big is the biggest one? If there are 2 legs on each body part how many legs does it have? Think about your doubling work!	Maths Follow the link to White Rose Maths Activities at the bottom of this timetable and look at Week 3 Day 3: How many pieces of fruit have you got? If we add them together what number can we make? The Whole/Part/Whole presentation might help you to do your adding – there's blank model below to help you. Can you write a number sentence to show your working out?	Maths Follow the link to White Rose Maths Activities at the bottom of this timetable and look at Week 3 Day 4: Planning a picnic – how many people will join your picnic? Can you make sure everyone gets the same number of sandwiches/tomatoes/apple slices etc? Can you draw the plates and make sure everyone gets the same amount? Maybe you can have a real at home picnic?	There are activities for day 5 on the White Rose website which you might fun, but it's a holiday today to celebrate VE day, so you don't have to do work if you are having fun and relaxing with your family!!
