Dear Parents,

Well done for the hard work you have put into your child's learning this year. We know it has not been an easy task and we appreciate all that you have done to keep up with their learning. Thank you also, for the support you have shown us as a school.

Over the summer, we would recommend that you continue practising the reading and writing of the phase words and that you continue to share books with the children on a regular basis. Allowing them to have a go at reading themselves and listening to you reading to them are the best ways to ensure that they progress and are reading for year 1. We wish you all a lovely summer and look forward to seeing the children back in September happy and settled in their new classes.




