St. Edmund's Catholic Primary School

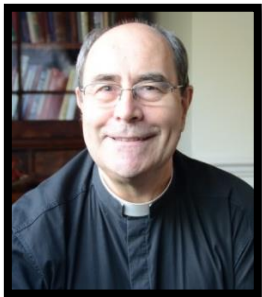
"Parish, Family, School"

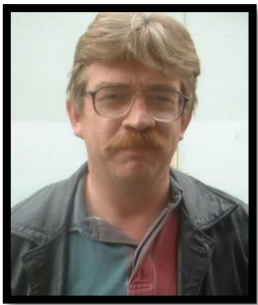
