## Activities for the week Phonics (all week)

We are continuing our Phase I phonics which focuses on listening skills. Last week we did Aspect 3 and this week we will be working on Aspect 4.

This aspect aims to develop children's appreciation and experiences of rhythm and rhyme in speech. Activities include rhyming stories, rhyming games and noticing the rhythm in nursery rhymes. BBC iplayer has a lot of Julia Donaldson rhyming stories (The Gruffalo, The snail and the whale, Stick man, Room on the broom etc) that you can watch. You might have some rhyming books at home as well.
