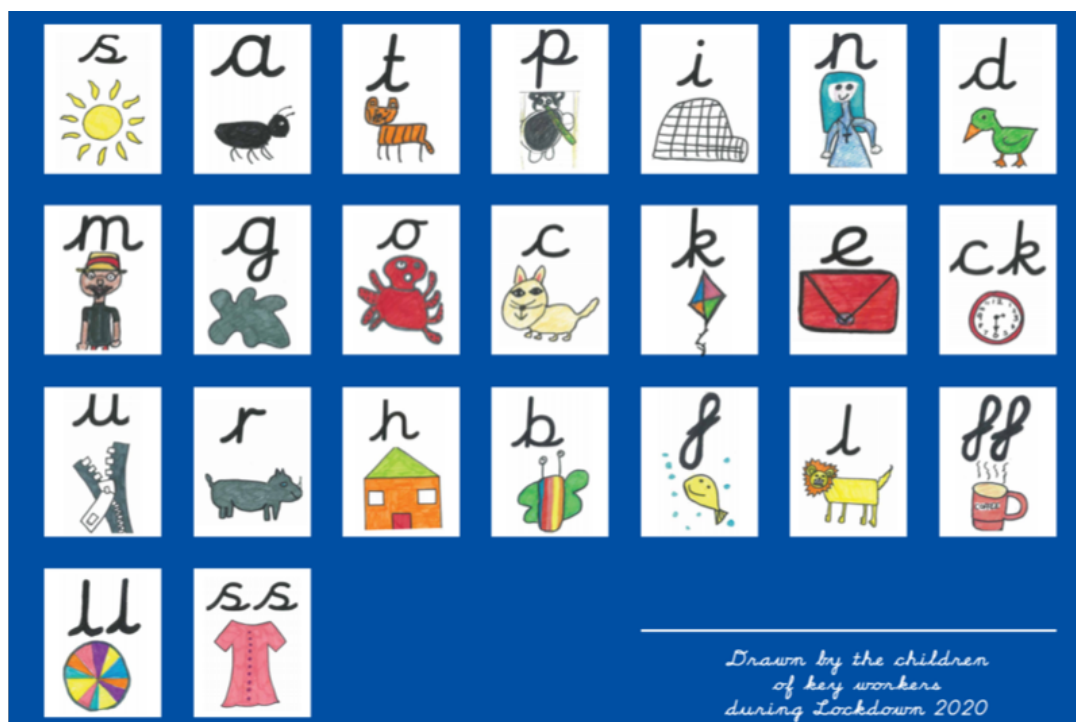

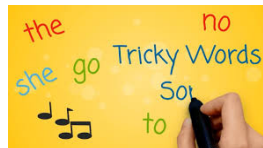
Revision of Phase 2 and Phase Three words
