Attendance

Congratulations to **Year 2** for achieving the best attendance in the school for the past fortnight with 98.16%. Amazing!

96%-100% attendance	Your child has the best chance of success!
90-95% attendance	Your child has missed at least 2 weeks of learning, that could be 10 literacy lessons and 10 maths lessons.
85%-89% attendance	Your child has missed at least 4 weeks of learning, that could be 20 literacy lessons and 20 maths lessons.

At St Edmund's we aim for each of our children to have an attendance percentage of 95%+. If you need help to get your child into school, please let Mrs Moreland know.

Messages on Google Classroom should be checked regularly to help you help your child – they contain important class updates.


British Science Week

At St Edmunds we have enjoyed celebrating the 30th Anniversary of British Science Week with the theme of 'Time'.

The week started with Mrs Moreland launching our whole school participation of 'The Big Plastic Count' during assembly, explaining how plastic degrades so slowly over 'time' that reducing plastic waste is an urgent target for our planet.

Over the school classes have linked the 'Time' theme to their science topics in exciting ways. Year 6 have hidden butterflies across the school to show adaptation over 'time' to environments and Year 5 made slime to show irreversible changes. Year 4 have explored how electricity use has changed over time, Year 2 worked hard on their 'Time' posters and Year 3 debated what life would be like without clocks!

We have also looked at what changes outside over time, and Year 1 have repeated their previous 'Autumn school walk' to show changes with spring coming whilst Reception have been planting seeds and observing their growth.



During Science Week this week, Year 4 delved into the fascinating evolution of electricity and its transformative impact on our lives. Yesterday, the children created their own electrical circuits experiencing how electricity works first hand.

Year 6 - Breadmaking



This week Year 6 used their conversion of measurement skills to successfully make bread dough. They all had great fun. We hope the families enjoyed baking and eating the bread the children brought home.

Year 6 – Orleans House Gallery



Over the past couple of weeks, Year 6 visited Orleans House Gallery for a 'Drawing with Wire' workshop which was inspired by their current exhibition. The Play Works exhibition explores the world of play and imagination, allowing children to be free to choose how and what they play and explore. The art workshop allowed the children to be free to create a wire sculpture either based off a feeling or inspired by something they saw when immersing themselves in the exhibition.



Year 4 – Science Museum Visit



Year 4 had the 'shock' of their lives this week as they witnessed real lightning being made at the Science Museum in London. A fabulous introduction to their Electricity topic. The children explored the immersive Wonderlab taking part in physics experiments and observing chemical reactions.

Year 1 – Visit to The Look Out Centre



On Thursday, Year 1 went on a wonderful trip to the Lookout Centre in Bracknell. They enjoyed trying to open the treasure chest, making paper creations that could fly in the wind, water play and building houses (great team work). The show gave them an introduction to the stars and planets and hopefully they can all look for the North Star and Jupiter when there is a cloudless night.

I loved building dens outside with my friends. I loved putting tiles on the roof in the building site. I loved trying to make the paper airplane fly really high.

FUEL: Holiday Activity and Food programme -Easter bookings open

FUEL provides free activities and food for children and young people who are in reception up to Year 11 and who are receiving benefit related free school meals (this is different to the universal free school meals that all children now receive at primary school).

Young people who are eligible should have a 17 digit FUEL code that will have been given to them by their school. You can use this to show that they are eligible when booking a club.

Measles Update

Due to low uptake of the very safe and free MMR vaccine over the years, there has been a resurgence of the measles virus in the UK and Ireland. Since October 2023, there have been 581 cases of Measles in England alone, with 363 of them being in January and February 2024.

Measles is extremely infectious, can spread very easily and some children can develop serious complications from a measles infection. Nine out of ten children can catch measles from an infected classmate. Please check your child's vaccination status.
